Thirty-five years ago, Pamela Trojanowki and her carpenter husband, Richard, bought a neglected 1940s home in Mattituck and decided to restore it. Today, the three-bedroom, one-bath, cedar-shingled Cape Cod on almost an acre backing scenic wetlands reflects Richard's craftsmanship. It is on the market for \$479,000.

Wide pine floors in the living room, dining room and hallway set the tone of the home, composed of three stand-alone structures plus a shed for garden equipment. A 24-by-30-foot red door barn functions as a workshop and contains a loft space for storage. An additional detached garage accommodates another car.
